NARCOG Attends Career Fairs

Students explore career opportunities in local government.

North Central Alabama Regional Council of Governments (NARCOG) has been spending time with schools showcasing the variety of career paths NARCOG offers.

NARCOG had the opportunity to participate in the 2023 Hartselle City Schools: Finding Your Future Career Fair on January 30. This career fair partnered with the Hartselle Area Chamber of Commerce and had over 2,000 individuals attend, including both students and parents.

Roughly 50 booths were set up in the cafeteria and the gym featuring various businesses around North Alabama as well as Hartselle High School Academic Programs. Students and parents could see what NARCOG offers, including career options, salaries, benefits, and educational requirements.

In addition, NARCOG was able to attend the Decatur-Morgan Chamber of Commerce Career Fair. At this all-day event, over 50 companies participated at Ingalls Harbor Pavilion, showcasing a multitude of career paths. A total of 16 schools and roughly 750 students in attendance.

As always, the Robotic Pets, a program that provides robotic

pets to individuals with dementia, was a huge hit with the students. With all of the opportunities NARCOG offers, there is a large variety of career paths for the upcoming young workforce to explore.

NARCOG currently has over 30 different career paths in various departments, including Aging, Social Work, Transportation, Planning and Economic Development, Administration, and Finance. As NARCOG continues to grow, new jobs will be created to continue to serve the community.

This year, the Administration for Community Living has named this year's Older Americans Month theme as Aging Unbound.

NARCOG is currently planning the Older Americans Month Celebration Luau on May 10th at Ingalls Harbor Pavilion in Decatur, Alabama, from 9:30 AM to 1 PM.

This celebration is free to seniors! The Older Americans Month Luau will include lunch, games, dancing, a live DJ, and door prizes. All seniors in Cullman, Lawrence, and Morgan counties are welcome to come in and enjoy the fun. This event

is indoors and will take place rain or shine.

Regional Planning Agency Update

The NARCOG Regional Planning Agency (RPA) has been extremely busy and growing again.

To help the RPA team keep up with their busy schedule, Tina Atkins was hired as a part-time administrative assistant. Ms. Atkins has been helping set meetings, file data, and assist with general organization. She is an essential part of the RPA team to ensure things continue to run smoothly as they take on more work.

Most recently, the RPA has submitted five Rebuild Alabama Act (RAA) applications for 2023. The RAA Annual Grant Program is an Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) funds projects that improve classified roads or bridges open to public traffic.

In Cullman County, grant ap-

plications were submitted for the Town of Colony, the Town of Berlin, the Town of Fairview, and the Town of Garden City. In Lawrence County, a grant application was submitted for the Town of Hillsboro.

These towns are all seeking assistance with roadway rehabilitation through this funding opportunity. In all, roughly \$1.2 million in funds are being applied for this fiscal year through ALDOT's Rebuild Alabama Act Grant.

In early February, the RPA team checked in on the progress of a trail rehabilitation project that was funded in 2021. The Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs awarded two Regional Trail Program (RTP) grants to the Cullman Coun-

ty Commission amounting to nearly \$525,000 in grant funds was awarded, and the Cullman County Commission will provide over \$315,000 in matching funds.

The first RTP grant will be used to replace bridges on the trail, fix roadways, install new reflective signage and solar panel lighting to allow for trail usage at night. The second RTP grant was used to purchase an excavator and a four-wheel drive backhoe for trail reconstruction.

Signs are currently being installed, and bridge construction will be underway soon. Trail rehabilitation is also in the works with the new equipment.










Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program



The Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) applications are officially live! SFMNP is a program that allows qualifying seniors a way to purchase fresh produce from their local farmer's markets. Seniors can purchase fresh fruit, vegetables, cut herbs, and locally harvested honey.

The SFMNP provides a onetime benefit of 30 dollars that can be used over multiple visits until the balance equals zero. The 30-dollar voucher can only be used at farmers markets and does not include commercial grocery stores. Seniors are asked to have their card from last year when reapplying, if possible. This program is considered first come, first serve, and applications will be closed when funds have been distributed completely.
