Schedule a ride by calling 256-580-2088. The NARCOG RTA provides transit services in Lawrence and Morgan counties and serves both rural and urban areas. This service is available by scheduling a ride at least 24 hours in advance and by no later than 2 p.m. the day before. Trips outside the Region are limited to a 50-mile radius of the NARCOG office, and cannot cross state lines.

Public transportation delivers option to help with rising fuel costs

Fuel prices are on the rise, reaching record highs this month. Relief does not appear to be in the near future. According to the American Automobile Association's (AAA) Alabama office, the average cost of gas throughout the state is \$4.20 per gallon.

That's an increase of 28 cents from a month ago — and more than a dollar from the previous year.

Because of the rising costs, peo-

ple across the country are feeling the financial pinch in their bank accounts.

NARCOG seeks volunteers to deliver meals

Senior citizens in Lawrence and Morgan counties need assistance.

The North Central Alabama Regional Council of Governments (NARCOG) is searching for volunteers to assist with the "More than a Meal" program, delivering nutritious meals to homebound seniors in the Region.

Through the NARCOG More than a Meal program, seniors who are 60 and older are provid-

ed a nutritious meal five days a week at their local senior centers. But, for those seniors who are homebound, the meals are delivered to their homes.

Delivering these meals, however, requires help.

In Lawrence and Morgan counties, NARCOG is seeking volunteers to deliver meals to homebound seniors.

During the height of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 and

2021, the number of volunteers decreased, prompting the NAR-COG Regional Transit Agency (RTA) to depend primarily on its drivers to ensure homebound seniors received daily meals.

Now that some of the pandemic restrictions have been loosened, the agency has shifted back to its traditional services of providing transportation to customers. The RTA resumed non-essential trips on Nov. 1, 2021.

If you do not live near the destination, then most likely an automobile is needed to help you arrive.

And for those who live on a fixed income, fitting the high fuel costs into the budget requires trimming some other items out.

But for those who live in the North Central Alabama Regional Council of Governments (NAR-COG) Region, there is another option:

Public transportation.

The NARCOG Regional Transit Agency (RTA) provides affordable public transportation in Lawrence and Morgan counties.

For those who reside in Cullman County, the Cullman Area Rural Transportation System (CARTS) provides public transportation.



The NARCOG RTA provides oneway trips in the Urban Area of Decatur, Hartselle and Trinity for \$2.

Each one-way trip in Lawrence

and Morgan counties is \$2 per every five miles, but no one-way trip will exceed \$10.

In Cullman County, CARTS provides one-way trips up to seven miles for \$2. One-way trips ranging from 7-15 miles are \$4, and any one-way trip that exceeds 15 miles is \$6.

CARTS provides a 50-percent discount on its fares for those who are disabled or 60 and older.

Both the NARCOG RTA and CARTS offer discounts for those who frequently utilize the public transportation services.

The NARCOG RTA offers Connect Cards, which allows riders to purchase \$22 worth of fares for \$20. For those utilizing Urban Area fares, this means for every five one-way trips, the sixth would be free.

CARTS offers a similar program with \$10 and \$20 punch cards, along with \$3 Cullman County shopping routes.

One-way Urban Rides in Decatur, Hartselle and Trinity are \$2. portation.

The events are opportunities for public transportation personnel to showcase their professional skills with friendly competion among peers, while also networking and collaborating on everything from equipment to preventive maintenance practices.

Each one-way trip in Lawrence and Morgan counties is \$2 per every five miles, but no one-way trip will exceed \$10. The NARCOG RTA's hours of operation are 7 a.m.-5 p.m. on Monday through Friday. The office is closed on weekends.
