The community's response surpassed expectations, with over 300 blankets collected during the drive. This impressive total illustrates the generosity and compassion inherent in the community members who contributed to this meaningful cause.

Thank You To Our Veterans


In the spirit of gratitude and appreciation during this past Veterans Day, we wanted to take a moment to extend our deepest thanks to the remarkable veterans within our organization.

NARCOG Planning staff including Joey Hester, Jacklyn Moore, and Erica Dillard attended the North Alabama Economic Development Symposium at the Toyota Field on November 7th, 2023 covering the (EV)olving Landscape.

Some speakers included Brooks Kracke with NAIDA, Mayor Paul Finley with the City of Madison, Jim Searcy – Executive Director for EDAA, Mike Oatridge -Director of Alabama Mobility & Power Center, Josh Krauss -Site manufacturing Engineering for First Solar, and others. The presentations

covered various topics such as electric vehicles, solar energy, etc.

Key Speaker Josh Krauss presented about First Soar and explained where manufacturing locations are including Ohio, Malaysia, Vietnam, and one right here in Trinity, AL whom the NARCOG planning department is administering two grants for \$2.5 Million for the 16" industrial sewer force main, paving of the entrance road to the Mallard Fox West Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP), and the extension of the 20" water main from its current termination point

(near Jack Daniel Cooperage) south along Cooperage Way to the Norfolk Southern Railroad.
